Here are some wise words from Heather Kojan, our founding president about how to approach QuiltCon:

Classes: I don't take a lot of classes. You don't want to spend all your time in class.Choose quilters who you particularly admire, or who you may not be able to take a live class with or zoom.

Lectures: You definitely want to buy a ticket for the keynote speaker. Lectures are a great way to "see" your favorite quilters, but not have to commit to a class - also less expensive.

Quilt Show/Vendors: I break up the quilt viewing into several days. Vendors as well. Don't try to see all the quilts all at the same time. Your head will swim.

Other Activities: Look for emails from the MQG.I like to leave time to see any local museums or attractions. Leave time for serendipity. Put yourself out there to meet new people. Join others for meals. But also take some time to be alone. It's a lot and can be exhausting, but in the best way.

Required:

- Sewing machine
- Light gray piecing thread
- (my favorite is Aurifil 2600 Dove)
- Ruler (at least 12")
- Rotary cutter
- Cutting mat
- Thread snips
- Small Clover Clips

All fabric

Suggested:

- Light box
- Add-a-Quarter ruler
- Finger presser
- Safety cutting glove
- Tweezers
- Card stock/hard edge for folding
