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## De-Stash Opportunity

We have been invited by Imani Haynes, a curator at the Reginald F. Lewis Museum in Baltimore, to contribute fabric scraps for an upcoming exhibit titled: **Black Woman Genius - Elizabeth Talford Scott - Tapestries of Generations**. The installation, called "Forget-Me-Knots" will be interactive and encourage visitors to the museum to create knots with the fabric scraps, and by attaching these knots to a mesh substrate, create a rug that reflects the work of Ms. Scott, who used mostly repurposed materials in her artwork and quilts.

Scraps can be any size and don't need to be cut if larger than the minimum size of 6 to 12 inches long and 3 to 5 inches wide. If larger scraps are submitted, they will cut them up into usable sizes. Also note that the fabric doesn't have to be 100% cotton. It can be a cotton/poly blend or all polyester. This is your chance to purge your stash of non-quilting fabrics!

Please bring your scraps to our December meeting and Phyllis Cook will coordinate getting them to the museum by January 5. Thanks so much!
